RULES

The event is governed by the rules as defined in The Racing Rules of Sailing.

Section 3 '*Rules of Navigation*' of the *Loch Lomond Byelaws 2013* apply when meeting boats that are not racing, noting in particular 3.4(15). This changes the Part 2 preamble. Competitors can view Loch Lomond Byelaws 2013 on website

SAILING INSTRUCTIONS

The sailing instructions will be available after 1000 on the first day of racing at Registration in the clubhouse. They may be available on the club website at <u>lochlomondsc.co.uk</u> under Events.

ELIGIBILITY AND ENTRY

The event is open to all boats of the Flying Fifteen, K1, Hawk and Keelboat Handicap classes. Other classes will be accepted subject to a minimum entry of 5 boats.

The Portsmouth Yardstick scheme applies to boats racing under Keelboat Handicap class.

To be considered an entry in the event, a boat shall complete all registration requirements and pay all fees.

VENUE

Racing will be on Loch Lomond off the club grounds and around islands in the loch.

COURSES

FFs and K1s will sail sausage/triangle courses, and KBs will sail courses around islands and fixed club marks. Hawks will sail FF/K1 courses on Saturday and KB courses on Sunday.

SCORING

1 race is required to be completed to constitute a series.

There will be 1 discard if 4 or more races are held.

RISK STATEMENT

Risk Statement: Rule 3 of the Racing Rules of Sailing states: "The responsibility for a boat's decision to participate in a race or to continue racing is hers alone." Sailing is by its nature an unpredictable sport and therefore inherently involves an element of risk. By taking part in an event, each competitor agrees and acknowledges that:

- (a) They are aware of the inherent element of risk involved in the sport and accept responsibility for the exposure of themselves, their crew and their boat to such inherent risk whilst taking part in the event;
- (b) They are responsible for the safety of themselves, their crew, their boat and their other property whether afloat or ashore;
- (c) They accept responsibility for any injury, damage or loss to the extent caused by their own actions or omissions;
- (d) Their boat is in good order, equipped to sail in the event and they are fit to participate;
- (e) The provision of a race management team, patrol boats and other officials and volunteers by the event organiser does not relieve them of their own responsibilities;
- (f) The provision of patrol boat cover is limited to such assistance, particularly in extreme weather conditions, as can be practically provided in the circumstances.

INSURANCE

Each participating boat must be insured with valid third party insurance with a minimum cover of $\pounds 3$ million including cover for racing.

PRIZES

Trophies and prizes will be awarded to the winners and other high-performing boats.
