1 RULES

- 1.1 The event is governed by the rules as defined in *The Racing Rules of Sailing*.
- 1.2 Section 3 "Rules of Navigation" of the Loch Lomond Byelaws 2013 apply when meeting boats that are not racing. This changes the Part 2 preamble. Please pay particular attention to rule 3.4(15) of the Byelaws, which states: "No boat shall approach within 100 metres astern of a fishing boat engaged in trolling and displaying a 'trolling shape'." The 'trolling shape' is an orange ball perched on top of a short post or stick on the fishing boat.
- 1.3 Competitors boats should not be attached to the pontoon except in emergency or briefly when launching or recovering or disembarking crew.
- 2. RISK STATEMENT
- 2.1 Rule 3 of the Racing Rules of Sailing states: "The responsibility for a boat's decision to participate in a race or to continue racing is hers alone." Sailing is by its nature an unpredictable sport and therefore inherently involves an element of risk. By taking part in an event, each competitor agrees and acknowledges that:
- (a) They are aware of the inherent element of risk involved in the sport and accept responsibility for the exposure of themselves, their crew and their boat to such inherent risk whilst taking part in the event;
- (b) They are responsible for the safety of themselves, their crew, their boat and their other property whether afloat or ashore;
- (c) They accept responsibility for any injury, damage or loss to the extent caused by their own actions or omissions;
- (d) Their boat is in good order, equipped to sail in the event and they are fit to participate;
- (e) The provision of a race management team, patrol boats and other officials and volunteers by the event organiser does not relieve them of their own responsibilities;
- (f) The provision of patrol boat cover is limited to such assistance, particularly in extreme weather conditions, as can be practically provided in the circumstances.
- 3. INSURANCE
- 3.1 Each participating boat must be insured with valid third party insurance with a minimum cover of £3 million including cover for racing.

4 SAFETY REGULATIONS

- 4.1 In the interests of the safety of competitors and patrol boat crews, competitors shall comply with the instructions of the patrol boat crews. Failure to do so may result in disqualification from the Series. Abandoned boats will be recovered later.
- 4.2 The crew of a boat that retires from the race shall notify the Race Committee as soon as possible (via CB/RIB or Race Office ashore).
- 4.3 Committee Boat MORY will escort Keelboats.
- 5 OFFICIAL VESSELS
- 5.1 The Committee Boat for Keelboats will be 'MORY', a large white workboat. First race each day will be started from 'CEARDACH', a smaller white workboat.
- 6 CHANGES TO SAILING INSTRUCTIONS
- 6.1 Changes to the Sailing Instructions will be posted at least one hour before the time they are due to take effect.

- 7 COMMUNICATIONS WITH COMPETITORS
- 7.1 Notices to competitors will be posted on the official notice board located in the Clubhouse hallway.
- 7.2 The race office is located at the front of the clubhouse.

8 SIGNALS MADE ASHORE

- 8.1 Signals ashore will be made on the flagpole in front of the Clubhouse.
- 8.2 When displayed ashore Flag AP displayed ashore with two sound signals (one when lowered) means "The race is postponed. The warning signal will be made not less than 30 minutes after AP is lowered."
- 9 SCHEDULE OF RACES
- 9.1 There will be a briefing for all competitors at 1200 on Saturday on the lawn in front of the clubhouse (Inside if wet).
- 9.2 The start times are scheduled as follows:

9.3 No Warning Signal will be made after 1430 on Sunday.

10 CLASS FLAGS

Keelboat General Handicap Numeral Pennant 1

- 11 COURSES
- 11.1 The courses (KB Saturday and Sunday, Hawks Sunday only) are Appendix 1 including the order in which marks are to be passed, and the side on which each mark is to be left.
- 11.2 **Course Indication:** The course chosen for Keelboats (Saturday and Sunday) and Hawks (Sunday only) will be indicated on the Committee Boat at the warning signal.

12 MARKS

- 12.1 The course marks will be islands and fixed club racing marks (orange/white cylindrical buoys).
- 12.2 The starting mark for KB races 1 & 3 will be a dan buoy.
- 12.3 The starting mark for KB races 2 & 4 will be a dan buoy or a fixed club racing mark on the course.
- 13 THE START
- 13.1 To alert boats that a race or sequence of races will begin soon, the orange starting line flag will be displayed with one sound approx. 1 minute before a warning signal is made.
- 13.2 Races will be started using rule 26 with the warning signal made 3 minutes before the start, Preparatory 2 minutes before the start.
- 13.3 The starting line will be between the staff displaying an orange flag on the starting boat and the starting mark.
- 13.4 Boats whose warning signal has not been made shall avoid the starting area during the starting sequence for other races.

14 THE FINISH

14.1 The finishing line will be between the Club flagstaff and Club Mark A, except that Races 1 and 3 (for Keelboats) will be finished at intermediate points by MORY flying Flag S: the finishing line will be between the mast on MORY flying flag S and the nearby mark of the course.

15 TIME LIMITS

15.1 The time limit will be 2.5 hrs for Keelboats. Boats failing to finish within 45 minutes after the first boat finishes or within the time limit, whichever is later, will be scored "Did Not Finish". This changes Rules 32, 35 and A5.2.

16 PROTESTS and REQUESTS FOR REDRESS

- 16.1 Protests and Requests for Redress must be lodged within 60 minutes of the last boat finishing the day's racing.
- 16.2 Protest forms are available from the race office. Notices will be posted no later than 30 minutes after the protest time limit to inform competitors of hearings in which they are parties or named as witnesses.

17 SCORING

- 17.1 The Low Point scoring system, Appendix A, rule A2 will apply to all fleets: one race constitutes a series.
- 17.2 There will be one discard if 4 races are sailed.


18 PRIZES

- 4.3 **Personal Buoyancy:** Each competitor shall wear adequate personal buoyancy when afloat. This changes rule 40.
- 5 OFFICIAL VESSELS
- 5.1 The Committee Boat for Appendix 1 courses will be 'CEARDACH', a white workboat.
- 6 CHANGES TO SAILING INSTRUCTIONS
- 6.1 Changes to the Sailing Instructions will be posted at least one hour before the time they are due to take effect.

- 9.3 No Warning Signal will be made after 1430 on Sunday.
- 9.4 Note that the Keelboat Handicap fleet is due to start 15 minutes before the first *ff* race each day and on Sunday the Hawks will start 3 minutes after the Keelboat Handicap fleet. *All fleets* must keep clear of the starting line until Keelboat Handicaps are clear and on Sunday until the Keelboats Handicaps and Hawks are clear, or 5 minutes, whichever is sooner.

11 COURSES

11.1 The courses are at Appendix 1 including the approximate angles between legs, the order in which marks are to be passed, and the side on which each mark is to be left.

12 MARKS

- 12.1 The course marks will be yellow cylindrical inflatable buoys.
- 12.2 The starting and finishing marks will be dan buoys.

13 THE START

- 13.1 To alert boats that a race or sequence of races will begin soon, the orange starting line flag will be displayed with one sound approx. 1 minute before a warning signal is made.
- 13.2 Races will be started using rule 26 with the warning signal made 3 minutes before the start, and Preparatory 2 minutes before the start.
- 13.3 The starting line will be between the staff displaying an orange flag on the starting boat and the starting mark.
- 13.4 Boats whose warning signal has not been made shall avoid the starting area during the starting sequence for other races.
- 13.5 In accordance with RRS 29.2, if there is a General Recall starts of all classes will be in the original planned order.

14 CHANGE OF THE NEXT LEG OF THE COURSE

- 14.1 A change of course after the start will be signalled before the leading boat has begun the leg to the moved mark, although the new mark may not then be in position. A Green flag will indicate a change of the next mark to starboard and a Red flag will indicate a change to port. The new bearing will not be displayed. This changes Rule 33.
- 14.2 Any mark to be rounded after rounding the new mark may be relocated to maintain the original course configuration.

15 THE FINISH

15.1 The finishing line will be between the staff displaying the shorten course flag on the Finish Boat and the finishing mark. The finishing line may be shorter than the start line.

16 TIME LIMITS AND TARGET TIMES

- 16.1 The duration of all races is planned to be around 60 minutes for the leading boat: after this time has elapsed the Shorten Course signal (Flag S) will be flown and boats will finish the next time they pass through the gate. The time limit will be 1½ hours for the first boat. Boats failing to finish within 30 minutes after the first boat finishes will be scored "Did Not Finish". This changes rules 32, 35 and A5.2.
- 16.2 Failure to meet the Target Time will not be grounds for redress. This changes RRS 62.1(a).
- 16.3 After the leading boat in each class has finished, all boats will be finished the next time they cross the finishing line (see Courses for details): this will have the effect that any boat which is more than a lap behind the leading boat will sail fewer laps but still be credited with a finishing position. If however this would result in a lapped boat being given a finishing position and a boat which has not been lapped being scored as retired due to the time limit, the lapped boat will also be scored as retired.

17 PROTESTS and REQUESTS FOR REDRESS

- 17.1 Protests and Requests for Redress must be lodged within 60 minutes of the last boat finishing the day's racing.
- 17.2 Hearing Request forms are available from the race office. Notices will be posted no later than 30 minutes after the protest time limit to inform competitors of hearings in which they are parties or named as witnesses.

18 SCORING

- 18.1 The Low Point scoring system, Appendix A, will apply. One race constitutes a series.
- 18.2 There will be one discard if 4 or more races are sailed.
- 18.3 Results for the Silver and Classic *ff*s will be included in the overall results but identified as Silver and Classic fleets for prizes.

19 PRIZES

19.1 Prizes except for Club Trophies will be awarded in the Clubhouse as soon as possible after the last race.

- 26.3 **Course Indication:** The course chosen for Keelboats and Hawks (Sunday only) will be indicated on the Committee Boat at the warning signal.

27 MARKS

- 27.1 The course marks on Saturday will be yellow cylindrical inflatable buoys.
- 27.2 The course marks on Sunday will be islands and fixed club racing marks (orange/white cylindrical buoys).
- 27.3 The starting mark for Hawk races 1 4 will be a dan buoy.
- 27.4 The starting mark for race 5 for the Keelboats and Hawks will be a dan buoy or a fixed club racing mark on the course.

28 THE START

- 28.1 To alert boats that a race or sequence of races will begin soon, the orange starting line flag will be displayed with one sound approx. 1 minute before a warning signal is made.
- 28.2 Races will be started using rule 26 with the warning signal made 3 minutes before the start, Preparatory 2 minutes before the start.

- 28.3 The starting line will be between the staff displaying an orange flag on the starting boat and the starting mark.
- 28.4 Boats whose warning signal has not been made shall avoid the starting area during the starting sequence for other races.

29 CHANGE OF THE NEXT LEG OF THE COURSE

- 29.1 For Hawks on Saturday a change of course after the start will be signalled before the leading boat has begun the leg to the moved mark, although the new mark may not then be in position. A Green flag will indicate a change of the next mark to starboard and a Red flag will indicate a change to port. The new bearing will not be displayed. This changes Rule 33.
- 29.2 Any mark to be rounded after rounding the new mark may be relocated to maintain the original course configuration.
- 30 THE FINISH
- 30.1 The finishing line on Saturday for Hawks Races 1-3 will be between the staff displaying the shorten course flag on the Finish Boat and the finishing mark. The finishing line may be shorter than the start line.
- 30.2 The finishing line for Race 4 will be between the mast on MORY flying flag S and the nearby mark of the course.
- 30.3 The finishing line for Race 5 will be between the Club flagstaff and Club Mark A.

31 TIME LIMITS

- 31.1 The duration of Races1-3 is planned to be around 60 minutes for the leading boat: after this time has elapsed the Shorten Course signal (Flag S) will be flown and boats will finish the next time they pass through the gate. The time limit will be 1½ hours for the first boat. Boats failing to finish within 30 minutes after the first boat finishes will be scored "Did Not Finish". This changes rules 32, 35 and A5.2.
- 31.2 Failure to meet the Target Time will not be grounds for redress. This changes RRS 62.1(a).
- 31.3 The time limit will be 2.5 hrs for Hawks on Sunday. Boats failing to finish within 45 minutes after the first boat finishes or within the time limit, whichever is later, will be scored "Did Not Finish". This changes Rules 32, 35 and A5.2.

32 PROTESTS and REQUESTS FOR REDRESS


